Four to cutef, 8 to start in all races. 5. Running to be governed by Rules of D. T. C. Association, and Trotting to be governed by Rules of American National Trotting Association. 4. Entrance to be 10 per cent of purse. 5. Entries must specify age, name, color and set, and in running races must specify Jockey's colors, and must be made on or before Friday, 6th Octobor, or mailed so as to be received by the Secretary at Mount Forest before that time, except for races Nós. 1 and 4, entries for which will be received up to 5 p.m. on Saturday, 7th October. 6. Entries unaccompanied by the smooy will not be noticed. 7. Riders to appear is jockey costume. 8. Any horse distancing the field only entitled to first money. 9. Entrance maney of horses proven incligible will be forfeited to the Association. 10. Heats in the Trotting and Running! Baces will be trotted and ran alternately or not, as the Judges may elect. 11. 
