placed side by side on a quarterinch pipe. The four were lit and perfectly illuminated the church. The Indians wondered at the powerful light, and found nothing better to say than: "O the white men can do everything." Some asked if the coyote could not have found the same light. "Oh no," was the answer, "the coyote is beaten there."

On the evening of November 1 the light was tried in the magic lantern, and it proved, by far, superior to the former light used, which was from a four-wick par-

-:--:-

affine lamp. With the Acetylene gas the light is much more powerful, the details show much better on the screen, and there is no trouble whatever to prepare the light for the lantern.

After a few nights' trial with the four burners we managed to shut off two of them and use only the other two to light a room. A little over a pound of carbide is sufficient to keep the two burners alight all evening till 10 o'clock, and over an hour more in the morning.
