

It is amongst other things in chect enacted that our Governor may at any time after the passing of that act declares by proclamation that all or any of the Silver coins of the United States of America, or of any other foreign nation or State, coined before the nassing of the said Act, shall when of weights and dates to be assigned in such proclamation pass current and be a legal tender in the Provinces of Quebec. Ontario, and New Brunswick, at rates in currency to be assigned to them respectively in such Proclamation, to such amount in any one payment as may be therein declared.

NOW KNOW YE and We do hereby declare and proclaim that on, from and after the FIFTEENTH day of APRIL now next hereafter, the Silver coins namely: half-dollars, quarter-dollars, dimes and half-dimes, of the United States of America, coined before the passing of the hereinhefore in part recited Act of the Parliament of Canada, that is to say subsequent to the First day of July, which was in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three and prior to the Twenty-second day of May, which was in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three and prior to the Twenty-second day of May, which was in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three and prior to the Twenty-second day of May, which was in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and which are hereinsfer mentioned, shall, when of the weights and dates herein assigned in the mrepactively, in this, our Royal Proclamation, to the mount of Ten Dollars in any one payment.
