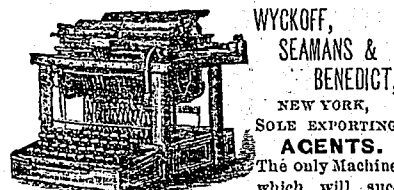

Commercial Summary.

The caption of the communicated article, on
page 270, in last issue, should have read—
"Banks and their Grain Accounts."

THE ESTATE of Scott & Paisley, of Brandon
Man., has been purchased by Mr. Paisley, who
pays the creditors 33 1/3 c on the dollar cash, upon
liabilities of about \$13,000, mostly due to
Montreal houses.

The amount of cotton in sight on Aug. 22nd
was 3,650,936 bales against 6,974,219 bales a
year ago, showing a decrease of 1,323,283 bales.
As compared with that of two years ago how-
ever there is an increase of 295,262 bales.

THE Federal Bank has disposed of the Potts
estate for \$800,000 to Mr. Tisdale of Simcoe,
being sixty-one cents in the dollar of its claim.
The amount of the purchase is doubtless in a
more available condition than the Michigan
mill and limits.

Mrs. C. ERNST, who invested a few hundred
dollars in the confectionery and fruit business at
Point Edward, Ont., last fall, has been unable
to make headway, and recently assigned, owing
about \$500, to pay which she showed stock and
fixtures estimated worth about \$225.

THE MANY friends of Mr. John Fraser, for
some years agent in this city of the Canada
Cotton Co., of which his old chief, Senator
McInnes, is president, will be glad to learn that
he has been appointed general agent of that
company for the Dominion. The appointment
takes effect the 1st September.

Mr. A. L. DEMARTIGNY, Manager of the
Jacques Cartier Bank and two of the directors
have been on a visit of inspection to Fraserville
Que., at the request of some of the citizens of
that enterprising town, who think it high time
they had local banking facilities. The estab-
lishment of a branch at that point is under
advisement.
