## DECISIONS RECARDING NEWSPAPERS

1. Any person who takes a paper regularly from the post-office, whether directed in his name or another's, or whether he has subscribed or not, is

anoners, or whether he has subscribed or not, is responsible for payment.

2. If a person orders his paper discontinued, he must pay all arrears, or the publisher may continue to send it until payment is made, and then collect the whole amount, whether the paper is taken from the office or not.

3. In suits for subscriptions, the suit may be instituted in the place where the paper is published, although the subscriber may reside hundreds of

miles away.

4. The Courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers or periodicals from the poet-office, or removing and leaving them uncalled for, while unpaid, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud,
