TERMS OF SUBSCRIPTION

In the British Empire: \$1 a year (4/6) in advance; \$1.25 in arrears. For 50 cents additional (2/-) per year a regular subscriber may cover another subscription which shall run concurrently with his own.

CONTINUANCE OF SUBSCRIPTION

In each case the month and year when renewal falls due are printed beside the subscriber's name as a record and receipt.

Prompt attention to renewals is valued.

No subscriber's name is deleted from our list without notification in writing from the subscriber and the payment to date of any arrears.

Changes of address should be notified in writing.

Payment should be made by postal orders or notes. When personal cheques are used, unless they are payable in Vancouver, 15 cents should be added for Bank commission.
