<b>Description:</b>	<u>Cross-Border Trade in Services and Investment</u> To be a licensed customs broker in Canada: (a) a natural person must be a Canadian national; (b) a corporation must be incorporated in Canada with a majority of its directors being Canadian nationals; and (c) a partnership must be composed of persons who are Canadian nationals, or corporations incorporated in Canada with a majority of their directors being Canadian nationals.
<b>Phase-Out:</b>	None
