Insurance Co. he resumed his studies and in 1949 received an M. A. in Sociology from Laval University; during that year he was also editor of "L'Eclaireur" in Beauceville, Quebec.

Mr. Houde joined the Department of External Affairs in September 1949. He served in Ottawa as well as abroad at our embassies in Brussels and in Athens and as a member of Canadian delegations to the North Atlantic Council and the Organization for European Economic Co-operation in Paris. In June 1961 he was named Chargé d'Affaires a.i. and Consul at the Canadian Embassy in Montevideo. In 1965 he was appointed Canadian Ambassador to Peru and Bolivia.

Mr. Houde is married to Yolande Chabot and has seven children.

RONALD MACALISTER MACDONNELL

Mr. Macdonnell, who was born in Vernon, B. C. on May 11, 1909, studied at the University of Manitoba (B. A.) and at Oxford (B. A.).

Mr. Macdonnell joined the Department of External Affairs in 1934 and was posted in 1935 to Washington and in 1943 to Kuibyshev, U. S. S. R. From 1944 to 1947 he was the Department's Representative on the Permanent Joint Board of Defence after which he was named Chargé d'Affaires a.i. in Prague. In 1950, he was transferred to our Embassy in Paris where he was Minister till 1952.

On Mr. Macdonnell's return to Ottawa he was appointed Assistant Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs. In 1954 he became Canada's first Commissioner on the International Commission for Supervision and Control in Cambodia and after this tour of duty, was promoted to Deputy Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs. After serving in 1957 and in 1958 as Canadian Ambassador to the United Arab Republic Mr. Macdonnell was elected in 1959 Secretary General of the International Civil Aviation Organization. On returning to the Department in 1964 he was Appointed Ambassador to Indonesia; he has been High Commissioner to New Zealand since 1967.
