NEW PAY SCALE FOR AIR FORCE PILOTS

Inquiries of the Ministry

Minister of National Defence. Has the government put into effect a new pay scale which provides increases of from \$300 to \$3,000 for defence department aircraft pilots?

Hon. Paul Hellyer (Minister of National Defence): Yes, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Harkness: I have a supplementary question. Is the minister aware that this is causing very unfavourable reaction among other flying personnel and servicemen generally, who believe it will decrease the effectiveness of the forces and further greatly decrease morale, thus accelerating the decline in the strength of the forces?

Mr. Speaker: Order, please. I do not believe the question as posed can be considered at this time.

Mr. J. P. Nowlan (Digby-Annapolis-Kings): Mr. Speaker, I have a supplementary question. In view of the substantial pay increases for pilots announced Friday last, is the minister considering similar increases for air crew navigators, radio operators and technical officers who will receive nothing extra according to that announcement?

Mr. Hellyer: No, Mr. Speaker. The fact is that the demand for skilled pilots in the civilian economy has so outstripped the demand for other trades that in order to compete and keep in the armed forces the number of skilled pilots we require we have to bring their emoluments closer in line with those of the civilian industry. Other categories referred to by my hon. friend will be considered in the cyclical pay increases which will come into effect on October 1.

Hon. E. D. Fulton (Kamloops): A supplementary question, Mr. Speaker. May I ask the minister whether he really expects that an increase in pay of \$3 million accompanied by a decrease of \$8 million will in fact keep pilots in the armed forces happy, or should we characterize this as one of the neatest tricks of the week?

Mr. Speaker: Order, please. The hon. member is asking an argumentative question.

Mr. Nowlan: Mr. Speaker, a supplementary question to the Minister of National Defence. Is the minister aware of the violent reaction to the abandonment of the principle of equal pay for equal rank, and is anything being done to alleviate this abandonment of a long standing principle?
