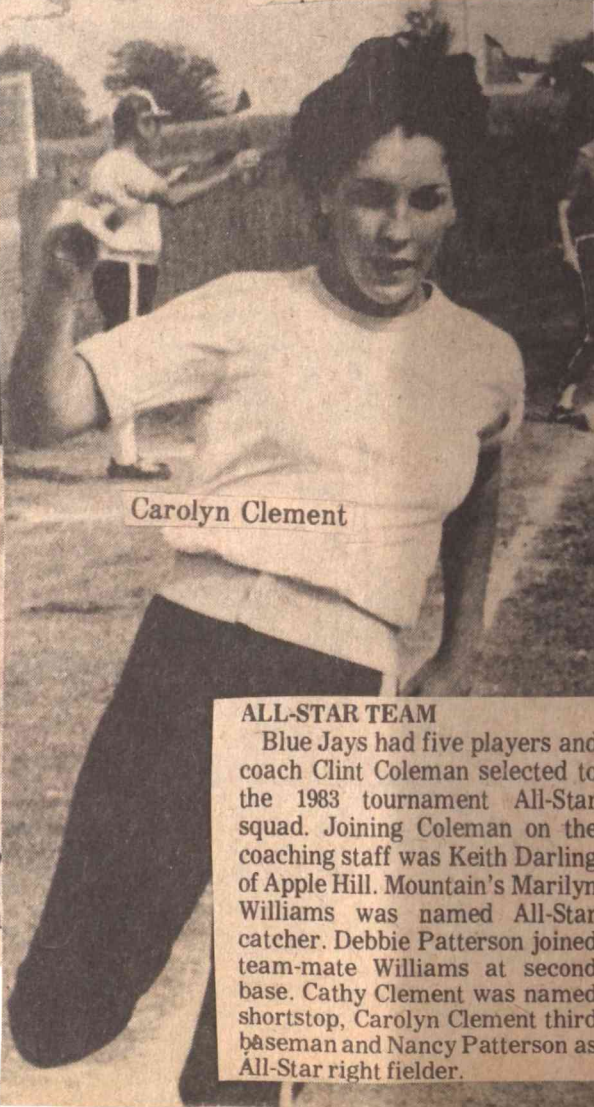
The host Blue Jays won the "A" division and accompanying \$350 in cash, Labatt's equipment bags and Willard Bellinger Memorial Trophy.
