Dr. Reid asked Dr. Caldwell if the Theological students were taking these fundamental subjects mentioned in the Faculty of Arts. Dr. Howard replied that the Theological students had been taking them, with the exception of Economics. and that they were now required to take them. Dean Laing, replying to Dr. Caldwell, said that no doubt his views represented the counsel of perfection. but thought that the lecturer in the lowly position suggested by Dr. Caldwell would not have a chance; and further, that if Dr. Caldwell thought Sociology would be a snap course, he assured him that such would not be the case. The Director, referring to Dr. Laing's description of Social Pathology, submitted that if the treatment of immigration, social diseases, poverty, city planning etc. by such well known professors as Dr. Hayes, Dr. Dealy and Dr. Fairbanks was indicative of the type of instruction which would be given by a Professor of Sociology or his assistant in McGilldwould result in courses which if not snap courses, would at least be non-academic. inadequate, and inaccurate. The Principal suggested that a Committee of two be

appointed to report back with recommendations in regard to, the future of the Department.

The appointment of the Committee was left in the hands of the Principal.
