By the Tenor of these presents We William by Divine Remission Bishop of Canterbury do make it known unto all Men, that on Lunday the Hinsteenth ... day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven We the Bishop before mentioned solemnly Administering Holy Orders under the Protection of the Almighty in the Chapel within our Valace at Lambeth in the Cof Lurrey, did, by Virtue of the Authority in us vested by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the Fifty-ninth Year of the Reign of his Majesty King George the Third, intitled "An Act to " permit the Archbishops of Canterbury and York and the Bishop of London for the time being to admit Persons " into Holy Orders specially for the Colonies," admit our beloved in Christ Feather stone Lake Osler 13, 11 Cath Hall Camil of whose virtues and pious Life and Conversation and competent Learning and Knowledge in the Holy Scriptures We were well assured) into the Holy Order of Deacores ___ according to the manner and form prescribed and used by the Church of England, and him the said Featherstone Lake Offer __ did then and there rightly and Canonically ordain Deacon; He having first deposited in our Hands such Declaration and written Engagement under his Hand as is required by the said Act of Parliament, and having also first in our presence freely and voluntarily subscribed to the thirty-nine Articles of Religion and to the three Articles contained in the thirty-sixth Canon, and he likewise having taken the Oaths appointed by Law to be taken for and instead of the Oath of Supremacy. And pursuant to the said Act of Parliament We do hereby state that WE did so or dain the said Featherstone Lake Oster -"CURE OF SOULS IN HIS MAJESTY'S FOREIGN POSSESSIONS."
