Dr. Theller was captured with the schooner "Anne" at Amherstburg, taken to Toronto where he was sentenced to Van Dieman's Land, taken to Quebec, where he escaped to the United States. He travelled through the United States with Mackenzie trying to work up an invasion of Canada. He removed to California, where he took up journalistic work and afterwards was appointed Superintendent of Schools. He died at Hornitos, Cal., in 1859.

The author was born in Scotland in 1789, enlisted in the 1st Royal Scots and came with them to Upper Canada in 1813. After the war in 1815, he commenced teaching school and after 38 years' service the pain of old wounds caused him to seek superannuation, receiving a pension of £28.10s. He took part with his regiment in many of the battles on the Niagara frontier. As the narrative of a participator in the struggle and also as a scarce and early imprint, this book is valuable.

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
