BOARDS AT LOGGERHEADS.

Controllers Decide Only to Pay Actual Expenses of Branch Libraries.

"PARAGON" HOSE WINS THE DAY

Contract Awarded to Gutta Percha Company - New Pavements - Firemen's Clothing.

At a special meeting of the Board of Control yesterday, the Mayor read the letter from Secretary Eyerson of Public Library in reply to the resolution of the City Council, which relegated to the Board of Control the provision of funds for the re-opening of the northern and western branch libraries.

The letter appeared in full in yesterday's World.

Controllers Woods objected to the tone of Secretary Eyerson's letter, which he considered conveyed a threat to the City Council. The Mayor said the Board of Control asked for a statement of the expense of running the two branch libraries. This the secretary had not given.

Controllers Burns, too, objected to the tone of the letter, and remarked that the secretary was not entitled to speak for the Board. It was a whip to the aldermen.

Controller Lynd favored giving the Library Board the expense of the two branches—wages, light and heat. In the present circumstances, there was no occasion to give them money for the purchase of books.

Controllers Burns acquiesced in this. Standing on their Dignity. Controller Woods: The Library Board are standing on their dignity and demanding money from the Council, because they are not responsible to the ratepayers.

Controller Lynd said there was no occasion for the secretary to send the board a copy of the original estimates. Looking at this, it appeared that only 25 per cent. had been spent on books and newspapers, whilst \$2,000 went for salaries.

Secretary Littlejohn was directed to write to the Library Board that the Board of Control would grant the necessary sum for keeping open the northern and western branch libraries till the end of the year, provided the statement of the cost already asked for were given to the board.

The Fire Hose Contract. A. H. Forrester, who was the lowest tenderer for the firemen's clothing, wrote to the Mayor, saying he was not in the United. He would, however, give a first-class suit at \$15.00, the contract was consequently awarded to the next lowest tenderer, J. A. Paul, Leader-line, at \$15.00 per suit.

American v. Canadian Carriage. When the two rival firms, American and Canadian Carriage, were under consideration, Controller Lynd took exception to the clause that Canadian carriage would be used instead of American. The latter, which was more expensive, was, he said, one of the reasons why the Canadian article could not be used.

The Mayor said that Engineer Rust was advised to procure this carriage in order to push on the work of street paving.

SEVEN MEN WERE KILLED.

A Locomotive Exploded in Mexico With Terrible Effect.

Chicago, Aug. 18.—A Special to The Record from Tampico, Mexico, says: By the explosion of the boiler of a locomotive on the Mexican Central in Newquimlan, and three other fatally injured. Among the killed are four American engineers, who were in the cab. Their names were Simon, Fitzgerald, Hussey and O'Connell. Another American engineer named Lockhart, was standing near the engine when the explosion occurred. He was hurled a distance of 150 feet, and was badly injured. The other men killed were three Mexican firemen and wood passers.

Independent Forestry.

James H. Gilmour, one of the supreme organizers, has completed a successful organizing campaign in Newfoundland and is about arranging to return home on Tuesday. The Supreme Chief Ranger, Dr. Oronhyakcha, is accompanied by the Supreme Secretary, Supreme Treasurer and Supreme Secretary of Education. They will represent the Supreme Council of Independent Forestry. Dr. Oronhyakcha is Vice-president of the Council. The independent Foresters will be represented at the annual convention of the International Association of Foresters which is being held in Toronto at the present time. The Dominion Construction and Paving Company have been allowed to withdraw their tender for paving Russell-street.


A letter complaining of the unsatisfactory condition of premises on Parley-avenue was referred to the Board of Health.

A strong iron box purchased by the city over six years ago and used for the custody of the civic archives has been removed from the old City Hall to the Treasurer's Department in the new building.


