Boston, Mass., March 21.—Reports from various parts of New Engiand received to-day indicate that this morning an earthquake was felt nearly all over New England, and the Maritime Provinces. In extent and severity astronomers say it was the most remarkable in 20 years.

The motion of the earth was most violent, apparently in Eastern Maine, where from three to seven distinct shocks were felt. Bar Harbor noted seven shocks of a violence sufficient to cause the fire alarm bell to strike several times. Calais, Me., reported that buildings were rocked so as to shake pictures from the walls. At Harvard observatory three shocks were noted. It was timed at 1.04.07 a.m. and lasted three seconds.


