NUTTER TO TAKE \$2,000 AND CALL OFF ALL ACTIONS

Two Big Suits Are Settled Without Any Costs.

CASE ENDS UNEXPECTEDLY

Interested Parties Get Together and Arrange Matters Satisfactorily.

The Nutter suits arising out of the erection of the Technical School abruptly ended yesterday afternoon, when all parties interested got together and brought about a settlement.

Mr. Nutter, by the terms of the settlement, gets \$2,000 of the people's money. This is the amount the board of education has agreed to pay him. In lieu of this Mr. Nutter drops his \$10,000 slander action against Ex-Chairman Silverwood, and another action against Contractor Puthurbough.

Mr. Nutter is allowed \$250 cash as his expenses in his suits against the board. The other two actions are settled with costs.

Total Was \$26,622.32.

Thus Mr. Nutter for \$2,000 drops his action and pending actions for \$26,622.32, made up as follows: Board of education for services rendered and damages, \$5,622.32; Ex-Chairman Silverwood, \$10,000 slander; Contractor Puthurbough, \$10,000 slander. Mr. Nutter has already been paid \$1,203 by the board. This was the amount paid when he was suspended by the board.

It is presumed that Wait & Blackwell, the joint architects of the school, will receive a similar amount up to the time Mr. Nutter severed his connection with the board.

2. The defendants, the board of education, to pay \$250 towards the plaintiff's costs.

3. The actions against Puthurbough and Silverwood to be dismissed each without costs.

4. No action for slander, conspiracy or libel to be brought by the plaintiff against any person or corporation in respect of the matters connected with this litigation.
