"TO HELL WITH PROFITS" NOT SAID BY FLAVELLE REGARDING DAVIES CO.

Has No Qualms Because Paid- HAS BEEN MENTIONED Up Capital of Packing Firm Is Now \$1,500,000 From an Actual Outlay of \$250,000 in 1892 - Perfectly Legitimate.

TORONTO, Oct. 21.—Sir Joseph Flavelle, in the witness box at the Government inquiry into bacon profits at the city hall Saturday, explained his now famous statement, 'to hell with profits!" at length. Briefly, he said, the remark was made at a time when Canadian manufacturers were hestating towexpend the necessary money to carry out munitions contracts. His statement was not intended to have any application to the William Davies Company. His exact words had been: "If it is profits in relation to what I have seen (he having just returned from the front), and what I have told you, then your profits ought to go to hell, to which they belong." Continuing his evidence, Sir Joseph said: "And I would say just the sam today."

Sir Joseph said the remark had been associated all over the Dominion with the William Davies Company, and "the insincerity of the president of the William Davies Company, who, in one official capacity could say no one should have profits, and in his own capacity thought he should have a good deal Dofit."




