

NAVAL POLICY OF SIR WILFRID VINDICATED BY JELLICOE PLAN

Viscount of Scapa Advises Canadan Navy, With Canadian Naval Minister and Canadian Admiralty, Which Borden Government Threw Out-Several Alternative Proposals Made.

OTTAWA, March 10.-While private members dawdled away the time of the House today, the corridors hummed with comment upon the report of Admiral Viscount Jellicoe of Scapa, who at the invitation of the Government of Canada and of other dominions undertook to investigate and make recommendations as to what part these descriptions. to what part these dominions ought to take in the matter of naval defence and naval contribution

His report was tabled in the House by Hon. C. C. Ballantyne, minister of marine and fisheries, and Liberal-Unionist, this afternoon. The minister made no comment in tabling the report, but later, in answer to a question on the order paper as to what action the Government-intended to take on the recommendations of Admiral Library 1. tions of Admiral Jellicoe, he declared that the House "would be advised as to prospective legislation."

Number of Proposals The report is lengthy, and will stand considerable study. There are a number of alternative proposals, and the adoption of any one of them is left to the discretion of the Government, and of course incidentally to that of Parliament. nothing dictatorial in the document; it is simply the expressed opinion of a "high naval authority," who has been requested to come and give his on the matter. But it may be noted that in all the proposals laid down, definite or alternative, the principle of a Canadian navy is recognized, with a Canadian naval minister responsible to Parliament, and a Canadian admiralty. Admiral Jellicoe goes into the questions of personnel and discipline. He makes recommendations with regard to rates of pay and pensions for officers a o00,000 pounds sterling, and that at present Australia's navy costs about two million pounds, or ten million dollars per year. The admiral mentions four alternative fleets. One which would cost twenty-five millions a year for maintenance would be led by two battle cruisers. Another which would cost seventeen and one half millions would be led by one battle cruiser. A third which would be headed by three light cruisers would cost ten millions. And the fourth which would consist of eight submarines, four local defence destroyers, eight patrol boats and four trawler mine-sweepers would cost but trawler mine-sweepers would cost but five millions. CANADA ENLISTED IN FIELDS OF WAR

OTTAWA, March 10 .- (By Canadian Press). - Mr. Joseph Demers, St. Johns and Iberville, was informed in the House of Commons today that the grand total recruited in Canada for the Canadian expeditionary force to December 31, 1918, exclusive of those enlisted for naval service, R. A. F., imperial mechanical transport, inland water transport, and exclusive of British and allied reservists, was 591, 492. There were enlisted in England 1,733; in Canada for overseas service other than C. E. F., 21,169; British and allied reservists, 14,590; a total of 628,964. Until all documents have been returned from overseas no final statis.

Canada is among the "first-class" members of the league of nations, according to a statement by Mr. Rowell in the House of Commons this afternoon. In conformity with article 6 of the treaty of peace with Germany, Canada's contribution towards the league is fixed on the basis of the apportionment of the expenses of the international bureau of the Universal Postal Union, but the actual amount which Canada may be called upon to contribute must necessarily depend upon the number and classification of these states which become members of the league of nations.

LONDON, March 10 -The reception by the exchange market of the sureme council's general findings on the conomic situation was somewhat qualified today by the absence of immediate palliative measures. The fact of the ecognition that Germany must be supplied with raw materials and credit in order to prevent her collapse was considered a good point, and the German mark exchange appreciated to 270. against 295 yesterday, to which point it had been brought down from 350 a few days ago under speculative buy-ing. OTTAWA, March 10.—Fuel supply and the eight-hour day were under discussion in the House this afternoon. UNCERTAINTY MARKS 628,964 FOR SERVICE TREATY NEGOTIATIONS IN SENATE OF U. S.

Dominion Pays Quota To Na- Hopes of Compromise Advocates Collapse and Revive.

> WASHINGTON, March 10. - The washington, march 10.—The peace treaty compromise negotiations entered a period of fevered uncertainty today as the time approached for final senate action on Article 10.
> Working desperately for an agreement, senators on both sides of the chamber confounded the plans of their party leaders and threw the Senate into such a tangle that it tacitly was agreed to delay a vote for several days, in the hope that all elements might be more certain of their ground. in the hope that all elements might be more certain of their ground.

> The hopes of the compromise advocates collapsed and were revived hourly as the day's negotiations proceeded in private conferences. The debate on the floor dragged along without apparent interest or effect. Tonight the conference continued, with some senators hopeful and others hopeless of the outcome, but with no one confident of what might happen.
>
> It was the treaty's irreconcilable It was the treaty's irreconcilable It was the treaty's irreconcilable opponents who started the trouble by remonstrating in a militant way against the decision of some of their party leaders to assent to a modified draft of the Republican reservation to Article 10. So effective were their representations that the leaders virtually decided not to offer the new reservation at all. This determination sent some of the mild reservation Republicans on the warpath and produced confusion also on the Democratic side, where senators had labored several days to line up votes for the Republican substitute.

Caught in a cross-fire from reserva-tion Republicans and reservation Democrats, the Republican leaders withheld their final decision, but indicated that they would probably present the substitute if assured of enough Democratic defections to adopt it.


