SAYS COUNCIL STIFLED HIS COMMUNICATION

James Brown Issues Writ Against Figures Go to Show That Trade is Being Driven Away. Mayor Baird of West Toronto - May Defer Annexation.

WEST TORONTO, Dec. 21.—A writ Baird and the corporation of West Toronto, and the corporation of West Toronto, and the corporation of the City of Toronto, claiming unstated damages. An order is also asked for declaring the bylaw passed by West Toronto Council, Dec. 7, authorizing the vote on annexation to be illegal and void, and for an injunction restraining annexa-tion "until the question of annexation alone is properly and legally put to the property holders of both defendant

On the Saturday preceding Christ-mas of lart year there was 105 farmers present, while this year a good deal less than half that number were to be seen last Saturday.


