

BASEBALL PEACE IS IN SIGHT

LADIES' ATHLETICS FOR THE UNIVERSITY

Inter-College Competitions Are Now in Order—Varsity Ready.

Early last spring communications were received from the women of Queen's and McGill asking Toronto University women to meet them in intercollegiate athletics. The matter was laid before the president of the university. He advised the formation of a women's athletic directorate to be composed of two faculty members appointed by the president, one graduate and one undergraduate member from each of the faculties. This directorate is to consider and decide upon all matters concerning intercollegiate athletics.

On Saturday, November 6, the directorate held its first meeting. Those present were: Miss Waddington, of the faculty; Miss Tom, St. Hilda's graduate; Miss Chant, U.C. undergraduate; Dr. Curran, medical graduate; Miss Chase, medical undergraduate; Miss Irwin, Victoria undergraduate.

The proposed constitution of the directorate was read, passed and sent to the Caput for its approval. It was decided that the directorate will be composed of members of the directorate.

Some of the questions that are to be decided upon soon should be discussed by the women's athletic association in the university. The question, "Should a member of a varsity team play on the team of her own faculty?" is to be considered at an early date.

SILVER LINING TO THE BASEBALL WAR CLOUDS

National and American League Club Owners Agree to Meet Today in Chicago—Minors Declare for Their Own Rights.

Kansas City, Mo., Nov. 10.—War clouds tonight appeared to be vanishing from the horizon of major league baseball. The agreement of the presidents of the National and American Leagues to meet in joint session in Chicago Friday to effect a peace treaty was taken as indicating an early settlement of the threatened baseball civil war.

To assure peaceful negotiation, no out-of-town players will be permitted to leave their homes until the Friday meeting. Lawyers are excluded, so that no technical questions can be raised.

President Ben Johnson of the American League and Heydler of the National League are to stay away, so that the club-owners may fight things out alone.

Announcement of the peace conference came in a dramatic way. Garry Herrington, manager of the Cincinnati Nationals, was addressing the minor league meeting here, when a messenger brought him a note. It was from the American League owners, who had met and decided at once to announce the terms of the truce.

President Johnson, in a statement later, said the Friday meeting was an effort to iron out the points of difference between the two leagues. The National League club-owners issued no statement, but it was understood that they would abide by what they had already done.

This was taken to mean that they would insist on the Lasker plan of baseball government, and on the appointment of Judge Landis of Chicago as chairman of the new board of control, at a salary of \$50,000 a year.

The minor league heads today, after hearing harmony speeches by Herrington, Charles Robb of the Brooklyn Dodgers and Barney Dreyfuss of the Pittsburgh Nationals, went into executive session, and voiced their opinion of the sudden affection manifested for them by the major league owners.

They determined that they would not cede any of their own rights. The minor league owners went on record as joining wholeheartedly in the campaign against gambling in baseball, and adopted a resolution to pass measures designed to stamp out the evil.
