The Ashery of Thos. Cloney has been established 32 years, and employs six hands in the manufacture of 160 barrels of potash annually.

The Brick Yard of Geo. A. Millward, on the Thorold road, has been established 10 years, and employs from 10 to 12 hands in the manufacture of 500,000 bricks annually.

The St. Catharines Stove Co., on Queenston street, corner of Page, was established in 1873 and incorporated in 1874. From 25 to 30 hands are employed in the manufacture of stoves, hollow-ware and general castings.

The Cigar Manufactory of Albert G. Fluke, on Ontario street, has been established 12 years, and employs 10 hands.

The St. Catharines Cotton Batting Co. was established in 1879. Capital \$15,000. Employs 14 hands in the manufacture of cotton batting and wadding, turning out \$200 worth daily. Geo. B. Towers, proprietor.

The St. Catharines Quilt Co., at 84 St. Paul street, was established in June, 1880. Eight hands are employed, turning out 400 quilts per month; mattrasses are also manufactured. Thos. H. Towers.

The furniture manufactory of Darragh & Daly, on Court street, was established in 1879, and employs from six to eight hands.

The machine shop and foundry of Geo. N. Oill, on St. Paul street, was established in 1846. From 30 to 40 hands are employed in the manufacture of marine engines, boilers, general castings, &c.

The St. Catharines Saw Works, on St. Paul street, the largest in the Dominion, were established in 1855. From 50 to 5 hands are employed in the manufacture of all kinds of saws, trowels, straw knives, &c. R. Smith & Co.

The St. Catharines Soda Water Works, at 155 St. Paul street, have been established 13 years, and employs five or six hands. Chas. C. Nelson.

The St. Catharines Pulp and Paper Co. has been established three years, and employs 30 hands in the manufacture of wood pulp, straw wrapping paper, and straw and card board.

The Steam Soap and Candle Works of James Bishopric were established in 1853, and employ four hands, turning out five tons of soap weekly, besides candles.
