TOULON, April 6—King Edward who arrived here last night from Biarritz, delayed the departure of the royal yacht in order to visit the battleship Jena, upon which the explosion of March 12 caused the loss of about 120 men. His Majesty expressed the sincere sympathy of himself and Great Britz, with the French navy in this diseaster. King Edward then went on board the Victoria and Albert and the royal yacht for Cartagena.
