WITCHCRAFT PRACTISED IN DARKEST NEW YORK

Blue Ribbon and Yellow Powders Superior East Siders Pretty Penny

Strange stories of modern witchcraft, were told to Magistrate Kerneohan in Boston Market court, New York, last week when Mrs. Carmela Rubino, of 30 Grand street was arraigned for practicing medicine without a license. Mrs. Rubino was arrested on a warrant obtained by the County Medical Society on information furnished by Leonard, Leonard and Giovanni Buffalo of 50 Wallace avenue, Jersey City, and Conchetta Spinella, The Buffanos said they gave the woman \$370.

Mrs. Lenora Bufanno alleges that about March 1 she visited the defendant's home and told her she was suffering from stomach trouble. The woman, she says, rubbed her with a yellow powder, which she said would cure her. For this treatment the woman demanded \$100. Two days later the complaint cured. Mrs. Rubino visited Mrs. Bufanno's home at midnight, and after weird incantations announced that the house "was full of devils." To rid the Bufanno home of the evil spirits, she alleges, Mrs. Rubino said to place 83 in a pan and cover it with and after which the defendant took the pan away, promising to bury it and its contents in a vacant lot. The devil would be charged her \$20 for doing so, and followed her.

Three or four days later Mrs. Bufanno visited the soreness and told her she still was afflicted with pains in her stomach and hiccupped. She alleges that Mrs. Rubino rubbed more powder on her, tied a blue ribbon around her left leg, and charged her \$20 for doing so, and followed her.

Recently a daughter of Mrs. Conchetta Spinella, a neighbor of the Buffanos, was taken seriously ill, and Mrs. Bufanno commented that Mrs. Rubino be consulted. Mrs. Spinella alleges that she did so, paying \$10 on the first visit and \$10 on another. Finally Mrs. Rubino agreed to cure the girl within a week for \$50. Mrs. Spinella promised to pay when her daughter recovered but the girl died and immediately Mrs. Spinella and the Buffanos lost faith in Mrs. Rubino. They demanded the return of the money they had given her and were warned by Mrs. Rubino that if they informed the police or made any trouble all of her complaints would be formed the medical society, which sanctioned the police of the facts. After hearing the testimony Magistrate Kerneohan remarked, "Now I understand why they need to burn witches."

Mrs. Rubino waived examination and was held for trial.
