

## MRS. E. BRUCE IS RE-ELECTED

Chosen Again as President  
of W. C. T. U. of  
Province

Saint John Names in List of Of-  
ficers—Several Resolutions

Mrs. Effie Bruce, of Campbellton, was re-elected president of the N. B. and P. E. I. branch of the W. C. T. U. yesterday on the closing day of the annual convention which has been holding its meetings in the Central Baptist church. 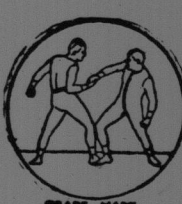
