Toronto, March 30.—Sir John Eaton is dead. After a gallant and remarkable fight with the grim reaper, over a period of about six weeks, which last week seemed to have brought victory to the patient, the end came at 8:40 tonight. The fatal relapse was reported yesterday. Lady Eaton, wife of Sir John; Mrs. Timothy Eaton, mother of the patient and widow of the founder of the immense departmental store interests of which Sir John was president; Timothy Eaton, the eighteen-year-old son who arrived from England only last week, together with other relatives and officials of the Eaton interests were near at hand when death ensued.
