# Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest

Land Regulations.

Any Person who is the sone head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Sakatchewan, or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Intry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader, may live within mine miles of his homestead on a farm at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Alust reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including) the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fity acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside is months in each of three years, cultivate fity acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
