NO INQUEST IN

Inquiry Made by Coroner Last Night.

Seller of the Death Dealing Liquor Will be Prosecuted.

After a careful inquiry, during which several witnesses were closely ques-doned Dr. W. F. Roberts, coroner, last the death of Frank Nowlin, who was found death in MacBeth's field Tuesday afternoon, was unnecessary.

The body of the victim of the drinking bout of Sunday afternoon was yesterday afternoon removed to Fitzpatrick's undertaking rooms to be prepared for burial.

The witnesses heard by the core

The witnesses heard by the coroner were Bob King, Thomas Wendall, Edward Mavor and Patrolman Covay. Their stories plainly indicated that Frank Nowlin, Frank King and Bob King had been drinking to such an extent on Sunday that all were blind

drunk.

Frank Nowlin was evidently more susceptible than the others and becoming altogether helpless was left alone in that condition, with the result that he was frozen to death.

Dr. Roberts will give permission for the body to be buried today.

One important fact in connection with the tragedy is that the whiskey was procured by one of the three on Sunday morning contrary to law.

The place where the liquor which caused the man's death was procured is known to the police and it is announced that the proprietor will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law.

NOTICE OF BILL TO AMEND MEAT AND

CANNED GOODS ACT

ON AND AFTER SUNDAY, Feb.
2nd, 1908, trains will run daily (Sunday

TRAINS LEAVE ST. JOHN. OTTAWA, April 1.—Notice has been given by the Minister of Agriculture of a bill to amend the meat and canned foods act and to repeal the canned goods act. The amendments to the meat and canned goods act are not radical, but are intended to meet minor objections found in the application of the act during the year. They chiefly apply to the inspection of small establishments. The amendments to the inspectors and sale act will provide more severe penalties for the fraudulent marking of packages of fruit and produce. It is found the magistrates allow the minimum fine of \$10 under the present act and this does not stop fraud. Canadian custom houses took in six million dollars more this year than last. During the fiscal year closing March 31 the customs collections totailed \$57,866,632, while the twelve months previous yleided a revenue of only \$51,812,599. Business was poor at the custom houses in March and the collections showed a decline of \$745,434.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATION 3

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency, for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he sc desires, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty, (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of a homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father (or mother).

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowances crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accord-

urement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.

Six months' notice in writing must be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of intention to apply for patent.
