This would include the building of a new reservoir, with a capacity of 248,000,000 gallons, and a high level reservoir with a capacity of 32,000,000. The capacity of the present reservoir is 220,000,000 gallons, and the new reservoirs would give the city a capacity of 560,000,000 gallons, equal to the consumption of a city of 20,000 people for 312 days, at an average of 80 gallons at head.

It is necessary to carry out this scheme the city engineer says, in order to get a better as well as a larger supply. To get the present supply it was necessary to raise the dam at the reservoir and flood a large area of heavy swamp and stump timber land. The decaying vegetable matter over this area has had a bad effect on the water in the summer season and the engineer sees no hope of improving this unless the water can be lowered and the surface cleared. It would be unsafe to do this with the present supply, hence the necessity, of new reservoirs. The city owns practically all the brook privileges in the vicinity, so that there will be no difficulty on this account.


