
Ottawa, May 2.—At the opening of the House today R. B. Bennett, of Calgary, drew attention to a despatch which he said he had seen in several Western papers, and which appeared in the Toronto Globe of April 29th, to the effect that the Admiralty thought it would not be well to force the Naval Bill through the House by Closure.
