TWO WOMEN BURNED  
TO DEATH AT CAPE  
BRETON MOUNTAIN

Both Were Nearly Ninety  
Years of Age — No Person  
Saw Fire and Supposed  
They Were Attempting To  
Escape When Overcome.

Sydney, C. B., July 10.—At Garloch  
Mountain, a farming settlement about  
seven miles from Lake Umbagog, Inver-  
ness Co., the Misses Mary and Bar-  
bara Johnston, each nearly 90 years  
of age, were burned to death in their  
home. Their charred bodies were  
found in a room by a boy. Just  
when the fire occurred or how, is not  
known, as the house was a consider-  
able distance from any other in the  
neighborhood.  
When the news of the tragedy had  
spread many visited the place and  
found the charred bones of one of the  
women on the ground just below  
where the window had been, and the  
other by the door, mute evidence of  
the effort of the women to leave their  
burning home. The elder of the two  
women had been a bed-ridden invalid  
for years.
