**Without A Country.**  
A lot of American young men who helped out the British lion in the war are probably in the same fix as Pie Roy Carmichael of the 15th, Canadian Battalion. Without a country—and will have to make application to the United States for reinstatement as citizens, unless Uncle Sam passes a law covering the situation. Hundreds of young fellows from over the border came flocking into Canada and joined the Canadian battalions going overseas, and in order to do so they had to change their citizenship, renounce their own country, and swear allegiance to Great Britain.

Pte. Roy Carmichael, in 1914, read of the war in his Kentucky home, and hearing they wanted recruits in Canada, lost no time getting here. He reached Niagara Falls, and in that city was directed to Toronto, where he joined the 15th Highlanders. At St. Julien, in April, 1915, Carmichael, with the rest of the gallant little band of Canadians, worked a machine gun until the overwhelming hordes of Germans compelled him to give up and he was taken prisoner. When led into a German prison camp Carmichael was unaware that he was then a man without a country, and he didn't know it until Saturday, when he applied at Buffalo to enlist in the American army. Discharged in Canada only a few days ago, Carmichael was told by the Buffalo military authorities that that act lifted from him all authority the British Empire had over him. He was told it would be necessary for him to apply to a United States Judge for his first citizenship papers, and that in time he will again be a citizen of the country in which he was born.
