SAMPLES FROM OTHER COUNTRIES

AT OTTAWA LABORATORY

Ottawa Jan 27—Regulations adopted some time ago to protect farmers from the evils arising from planting inferior seeds from other countries are to be enforced by the Canadian customs officials at ports of entry.

These officials have been instructed to forward to the Dominion seed laboratory for examination samples of seeds entered for consumption in Canada. Seed that has arrived in Canada and is found to be unfit will be deported under customs supervision.

The penalty for failing to comply with these regulations is \$500 for the first offense and not exceeding \$1,000 for the second and third offenses.
