CARON, Lieut.-Col. GEORGE, J. P. [*Maskinongé.*]

Descended from a French family long settled in the country. B. at Rivière du Loup, *en haut*, 1823. Ed. at Nicolet College. M. 1st, 1847, Dlle. Marie Aurélie, second dau. of Hon. E. Mayrand, a mem. of the Special Council, L. C.; 2ndly, 1860, Dlle. M. P. Fleury. A merchant. Is Lieut.-Col. Mas-kinongé Reserve Militia, and a Commissioner of Small Causes. Sat for present seat in L. A., Can., from 1858 until g. e., 1863, when defeated. Returned to Commons at last g. e. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir George E. Cartier. *St. Léon, Q.*

CARTIER, Hon. Sir GEORGE ETIENNE, Bart., Q.C. [*Montreal East.*] **P. C.**

Descended from a brother of the celebrated navigator and discoverer, Jacques Cartier, of St. Malo, France. S. of the late M. Jacques Cartier, of St. Antoine, River Chambly, by Marguerite, dau. of M. Joseph Paradis. B. at St. Antoine, 6 Sept., 1815. Ed. at the College of St. Sulpice, Montreal. M. 1846, Hortense, dau. of M. Edouard Raymond Fabre, of that city. Called to the Bar, L.C., Nov., 1835. Created Q.C., 1854. Was made an honorary mem. of the Bar of U.C. by the Law Society, Hilary Term, 1866. A director of the Montreal Mining Co., and of the Life Association of Scot. Is author of the French national song: *O Canada, Mon Pays, Mes Amours!* and of other songs, which have been set to music. Has been President of the Montreal St. Jean Baptiste Société. Declined Solicitor Generalship, L.C., 1851, and the Commissionership of Public Works, 1853.
