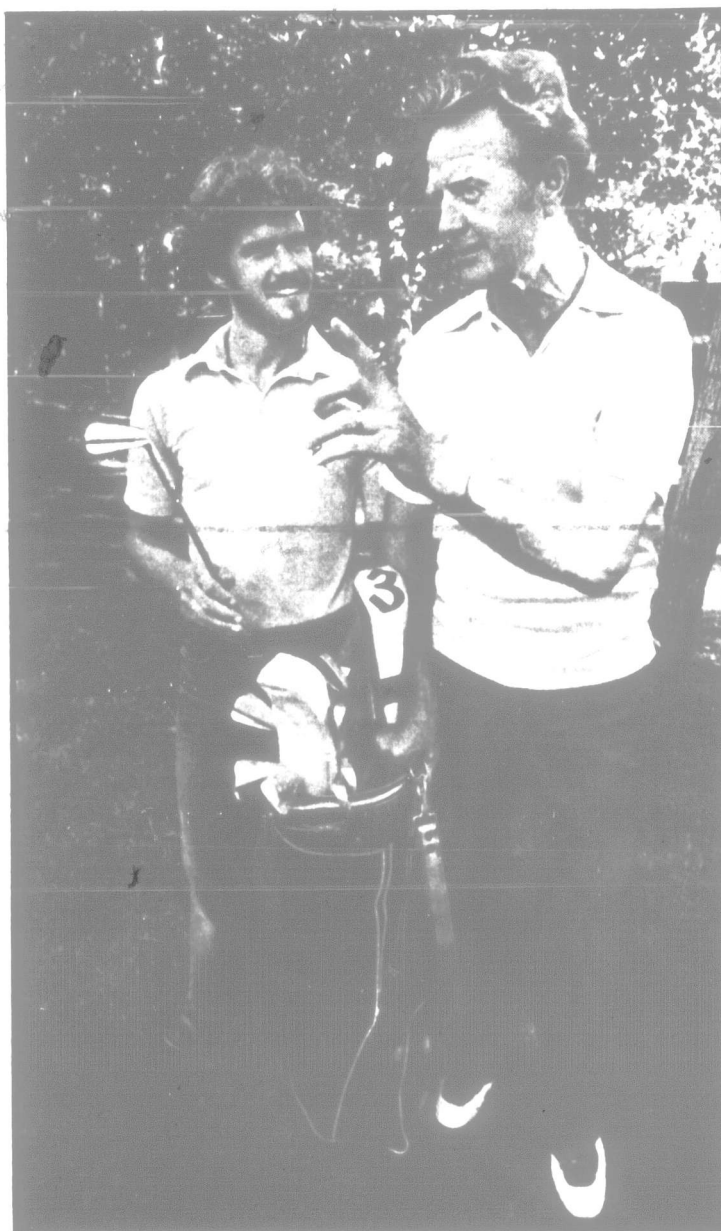
The Dewsons finished the tournament with a four-over-par 75, tied with Sarnia's Ross and Tim Dowsell. They won the tournament on the first playoff hole.

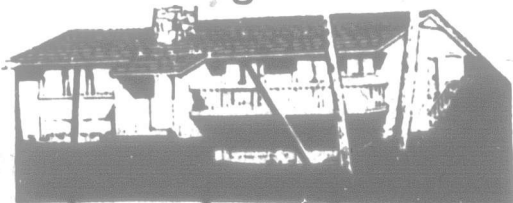
