EXPLANATORY NOTE BY-LAW NO. 1970-142

PURPOSE OF THE BY-LAW TO REMOVE THE FOLLOWING THREE (3) PROVISIONS FROM THE GENERAL PROVISIONS OF THE ZONING BY-LAW OF THE TOWN OF OAKVILLE:

13. (1) Nothing in this by-law applies:
(a) to prevent the use of any land, building or structure for any purpose prohibited by this by-law if such land, building or structure was lawfully used for such purpose on the day of the passing of this by-law; or
(b) to prevent the erection or use for a purpose prohibited by this by-law of any building or structure the plans for which were, prior to the day of the passing of this by-law, approved by the Building Inspector, so long as the building or structure, when erected, is used and continues to be used for the purpose for which it was erected and provided the erection of such building or structure is commenced within two years after the day of the passing of this by-law and such building or structure is completed within a reasonable time after the erection thereof is commenced.
(2) Where land was legally used on the date of the passing of this by-law for any agricultural use, nothing shall prevent the erection of a building or structure for use in connection with forestry, field crops, fruit and market gardening, the growing, raising, packing, treating, storing and selling of fruit, vegetable and nursery produce produced on the premises, provided the provisions of Section 56 are complied with.
(3) Nothing in this by-law prevents the strengthening or restoration of any building or structure or part of any building or structure, provided that it does not increase the height or area of the building, change the use of it or change the percentage of the building or lot used for any non-conforming purpose.

EXPLANATORY NOTE BY-LAW NO. 1970-132

PURPOSE OF THE BY-LAW The by-law, at the present time, permits a person to accommodate three (3) roomers within his residence, and he must provide one (1) surfaced off-street parking space per roomer. EFFECT OF THE BY-LAW The by-law, if approved, would permit both roomers and boarders to be accommodated in all single family residential zones, up to a maximum of three (3), along with the provision of one (1) surfaced off-street parking spot per roomer or boarder. A roomer is a person who receives only accommodation. A boarder receives both accommodation and meals.

"c) 'lot frontage' means the horizontal distance between the side lot lines or the extension thereof measured through the mid point of a line drawn parallel to the front lot line and 25 feet in perpendicular distance back of it at right angles to a line linking that mid point with the mid point of the front lot line, provided that where the width of the street upon which the lot fronts is less than the width required by subsection 8 of Section 16 the front lot line shall be considered to be a line drawn parallel to the centre of that street and one-half of the required width in perpendicular distance from it."
