Answer There are three Roman Catholic Missionary Priests attached to the Tribes of this Village. The Religious duties are performed in the different Indian languages - Iroquois & Mississaugan. The Reverend Gentlemen of the Seminary of St. Sulpice (at Montreal) established a sort of an elementary school at this Village in 1835 - at the opening of which many Indian youth attended during that summer - But towards Autumn most of the children accompanied their Parents on their hunting excursions - those that remained frequented the school but seldom. These Reverend Gentlemen, seeing it was useless - abandoned the establishment altogether. There is now no schoolmaster at this Station. These Missionaries receive no salary from Government - and the whole of the Expenses incurred on the school was defrayed by them.

Q^y. Whether the expenses of the Tribe or party, are defrayed from the Parliamentary Grant or from the Land payments out of the Territorial Revenue of the Crown.

Answer - The Annual Expenses incurred for the Indian Tribes in this District, are defrayed from the Parliamentary Grant only.
