alt the from point on the East side of the river opposite to the Stone fort already there, which is almost finished and that they have a great number of men there at work we must again acq! your Excellen of the absolute necessity of a wooden fort upon the \_ Carrying place Lead to Canada and do Intreat your Excellency To recommend it once more to the Gentrall Assembly to Raise money to build the same and to maintain a Sufficient garrison therein if this be not done it is not possible to keep outscouts as near our Every as we ought by reason they have no place of Retreat to Shetter theinselves in fase of need and we Expect our farmers will Break up if this be not done for as the fase now Stands they are Entirely at the morey of Tubtle & Enterprising Every which a fort in the place we mention would in a great measure prevent
