Uplands, Ontario	July 16th 1944	(Cont'd)	and greatly appreciated by the personnel of this Unit. W/C Davies, Principal Chaplain (P) at A.F.H.Q. visited the Unit in the afternoon.	
	July 17th 1944		Weather partly cloudy. Flying washed in at 0800 and out at 1730 hours, a total of 8½ hours solo flying. W/C W.R. Kingsland (C1972) assumes command of the Unit on return from leave. S/L C.H. Cowperthwaite from A.F.H.Q. reported on the Unit with the Equipment Audit Group.	
	July 18th 1944		Weather clear all day. 8½ hours solo flying. Meeting of all Section Commanders held in C.O.'s office. Forty-two airmen from 11 P.A.T.S. reported in for useful employment pending postings to course.	
	July 19th 1944		Weather cloudy to overcast with scattered showers. Three hours of dual flying and 5½ hours of solo. Uplands soccer team retained possession of the McGivern cup by defeating A.F.H.Q. Jackson Building team, 2 - 1.	
	July 20th 1944		Weather overcast with showers and thunder showers most of the day. Very hazy - flying washed in at 0800 hours and out at 1645 hours because of the rain. Four hours dual and two hours solo. Annual Station Weiner Roast was held in the Recreation Hall, due to inclement weather. Airmen and airwomen were permitted to invite guests. Approximately 350 people attended. The evening was a great success and thoroughly enjoyed by all.	
	July 21st 1944		Weather cloudy, flying washed in at 0800 hours and out at 1730 hours - 8½ hours solo. Regular Friday night dance held in the Recreation Hall, with about 250 people in attendance.	
	July 22nd 1944		Weather cloudy to overcast. 8½ hours of solo flying were carried out.	
	July 23rd 1944		Weather clear. No flying on Sunday. Services held in the Chapel in the morning were very well attended by airmen and airwomen and their families and friends. Early in the evening, a concert was presented by the Rockcliffe Central Band in the Pine Grove. A large crowd was on hand to enjoy the fine music. Following the band concert, a premiere showing of the film "Mark Twain" was held in the Recreation Hall and greatly enjoyed by a capacity audience.
