"AT THE SAME TIME THEY CANNOT BUT BE AWARE THAT ANY
CONSIDERABLE PROLONGATION OF THE PRESENT STATE OF SUEPENSE
AND UNCERTAINTY WOULD INVOLVE THE RISK OF GRAVEST INJURY TO THE
NATIONAL AND IMPERIAL INTERESTS--AND INDEED NO ONE IS MORE
INSISTENT UPON THIS ASPECT OF THE SITUATION THAN HIS MAJESTY,"
THE PRIME MINISTER CONTINUED.

"IN VIEW OF CERTAIN STATEMENTS WHICH HAVE BEEN MADE ABOUT
THE RELATIONS BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT AND THE KING, I SHOULD
ADD THAT WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE QUESTION OF MORGANATIC
MARRIAGE, NO ADVICE HAS BEEN TENDERED BY THE GOVERNMENT TO
HIS MAJESTY, WITH WHOM ALL MY CONVERSATIONS HAVE BEEN STRICTLY
PERSONAL AND INFORMAL.
