 regards the recommendation of Mrs
 McHenry that Miss Wilson be ap-
 pointed to the position of Teacher of
 the school which he thinks should be
 established for the benefit of the
 children of James Smith's Band (and
 it is supposed the children of the
 Cumberland Band could also attend
 it) such appointment to be contingent
 upon the appointment of her brother
 to the position of Farming Instructor
 to the same Indians, I beg to state
 that I note your remark that His
 Lordship the Bishop of Saskatchewan
 has been spoken to about the pro-
 posed appointment of a suitable
 White Teacher for the school; but
 the Indian Council for the St. N. 3 who
 is here at present, appears to be of
