(i) Particulars relating to subjects should not be regarded as a definite division. They are based on a survey of the telegrams, but there is nothing on record to show that the telegrams can be definitely classified except by destinations.

It is likely for an example, that a Circular C. communication might be sent on a certain subject and that the next communication might not concern all recipients of Circular C. and would therefore be sent in another lettered circular.

(ii) "Circular M" series discontinued as from January 1, 1942.

All other telegrams are numbered in a consecutive series for each Dominion except that telegrams to the I.F.S. are not numbered.

The degree of secrecy of each telegram is denoted by the prefix given at the beginning in code to show recipient degree of secrecy with which particular telegram is to be treated i.e. "SECRET", "MOST SECRET", "MOST SECRET AND PERSONAL".
