THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS.

oven aumhered section of Deminion Lande in Maniteba or West Territories, excepting 8 and 28, which has not been he d, or reserved to p-wide wood lest for extitent, or fire of he, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole h hamily, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of we section, of 160 acree, more or less.

ENTRY. Butty must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situate.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES,

ettler who has been granted an entry for a bemeetsed is required provisions of the Deminion Lands Act and the amendments, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of flowing plans:—

(i) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or motter, if the father is deceased) of the home-eader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for its requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person re-ding with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming laud owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (8) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestend, or substitute 20 hearstock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers all who completed the duries upon their first homesteads to entitle mem to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889.

Every homesteader who falls to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to ave his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent, the settler must give six months notice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION.

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the immigration Office in Winnipeg or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitoba or the North-West Territories, information as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistance in securing land to sput them. Full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Railway Belt in British Columbia, may be obtained upon application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, Manitoba, or to any of the Dominion Land Agents in anitoba or the North-West Territories.
