Funeral of Bishop Cameron

Halifax, April 13.—The funeral of Bishop Cameron at Antigonish was an imposing affair. Since Sunday the body lay in state in the Cathedral with guards of honor stationed about day and night. Lying in state, casketed, and attired in full Episcopal vestments, the bishop's body
