FEB. I. Last day for Railway Companies to transmit to Clerks of Municipalities statement of Railway Property.-Assessment Act, section 31.

- Last day for Collectors to return their Roll and pay over proceeds .---Assessment Act, section 144 (1).
- Last day for County Treasurers to furnish Clerks of Local Municipalities w th List of Lands in arrears for taxes for three years .- Assessment Act, section 152.
- Make return of deaths by contagious diseases registered during January.-5. R. S. O., chapter 45, section 11.
- First meeting of Board of Education, at 7 p. m., or such other hour as 6. may have been fixed by resolution of former Board at the usual place of meeting of such Board.—High Schools Act, section 14 (1).
- 15. Last day for Assessors to begin to make their rolls.-Assessment Act, section 55.
