Mr. Tonge pursuant to leave given presented a Bill for the cognizance, trial and punishment, of Spies; and the same was read a first time.

Refolved, That the Bill be read a fecond time.

A Meffage from the Council by Mr. Cogfwell :

Mr. Speaker,

His Majesty's Council propose the following amendment to the Bill sent up, entitled, An Act to provide for the greater security of this Province, by a better regulation of the Militia, and to repeal the Militia Laws now in force, to which they request the concurrence of this House:

Leave out the title, and the feveral claufes of the Bill to the word " and," in the eighth line of the last page, and instead thereof insert the following, vizt.

An Aû in further addition to an Aû, passed in the thirty-sifth year of the reign of His present Majesty, entitled, An Aû to amend and reduce into one Aû the several Laws now in being, relating to a Militia in this Province.

Whereas the Militia Laws now in force are infufficient for the purpose of training and disciplining the Militia for as to render them fit for active tervice; and whereas it is necessary to provide for the more effectual defence of the Province; under the present aspect of affairs and to strengthen the Military force of the Country:

Be it therefore enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That it shall and may be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor or-Commander-in Chief, for the time being, by and with the advice and confent of his Majesty's Council, to call out from time to time as may be judged requisite for the purpose of training and difciplining the whole or such proportion of the effective Militia of the Province, as he may judge lit and expedient, and to cause the officers and men so called into fer-
