In this "piping time" of political peace, we may be accused if we attempt to penetrate into the recesses of private life, and endeavor to draw out the idea of our yesterday's correspondent into more prominence, by stating plainly, not perhaps the fact, but at least the moral, relationally which exists, or ought to exist, between Masters and Servants.

We do not mean to insinuate that a good character is ever withheld from a deserving Servant; because we believe there is no instance existing of any such thing. But we know that attentions of character are often given to the undeserving. There is a certain want of moral courage—a sort of mental cowardice which clings to Masters, and more particularly to Mistresses, and which induces them to give attentions of character to Servants on their leaving which are wholly undeserved.
