Forty-four men and a boy, officers and crew of the Canadian to read to have been drowned in the gale that swept the Nova Scotian coast on Tuesday night. At three o'clock Monday afternoon the Grilse, the fastest patrol boat in Canadian waters, sailed out of Hallfax harbor for Bermuda. At seven o'clock Tuesday night the gallant little ship, beaten by the hurricane in which she had been caught, was seven miles off Little Hope Light, South Shore. At twenty-eight minutes past seven she sent out an "S. O. S." call. Two minutes later the message "now sinking" was flashed. Since then there has been no word of her. Vessels despatched to the rescue have combed the position in which the Crilles last resels despatched to the vecombed the position the Grilse last re-reself and have found of her. Finally it was d from Ottawa yester-toon that the Minister rescue have co in which th ported hersel no trace of h announced from

day afternoon that the Minister of the Naval Service feared that the Grilse had been lost at sea with all hands.

This is the worst tragedy that has occurred on the Nova Scotian coast for many years and the news of the disaster to the Grilse has caused deep sorrow here for the brave men who went down with her. "They were picked men," said a naval officer to a press representative last evening. "Every man jack of the crew was of the best, physically and mentally equipped to give the utnost efficiency to the handling of this very important boat in the Canadian Naval Service."

DEUTSCHLAND AGAIN ARRIVED HOME
