Begin with the bables. The milk supply must be overhauled and tested. Birth registration the day after birth and the proper treatment of children should be worked by competent surveyors and visitors. Ashletic training, proceeding from a sense of duty to the nation, must be made universal. The nation, must be made universal. The ideal of national life is not charity or patience or resignation or the capacity to suffer disease, poverty and misfor-

The multiplication of hospitals and The multiplication of hospitals and generosity to the unfit is to be avoided. Diabolical work is being done in the cap and gown of a sister of mercy. The ideal of the nation is beautiful women and strong men and happy children—all healthy, independent, determined and able to maintain their places in the struggle for life among the nations. To sterilize the unfit we must immure habitual criminals, paupers and the insane. Marriages should be forbidden by the State, except on the production habitual crimines, should be forbidden sane. Marriages should be forbidden by the State, except on the production of medical certificates that the parties to the marriages are not plainly unfit. These are the main lines of reform. If the British Empire perishes it will not the irresistible decree of Provifall by the irrestable decree of Providence. Our collapse will be the sequel of neglect.—Arnold White, in London Chronicle.
