JAPAN'S CABINET CHANGES. Several Houses Go Down—Japan's Cabinet Changes—Okuma Succeeds Ito as Premier—Rival Union Rows Lead to Murder—Stonemasons' Union Men Accused.

Chicago, Ill., July 2.—The following bulletin was posted at every Chicago newspaper office last evening: At 8 o'clock this (Friday) evening, the Stereotype Union notified the Chicago publishers of Chicago that unless their demands for an increase of wages from \$3.25 to \$4 per day, a reduction of the working day from eight to seven hours, and an increase of 75 cents per hour for all overtime, and other concessions, were not granted by noon on Saturday, they would return to work in consequence of this action, there will not be a newspaper issued in Chicago to-day.
