Freight to be forwarded from Sussex must be delivered at that Station at least one hour, and from other Stations than St. John, at least half an hour before the advertised departure of any Freight Train.

Goods for Prince Edward Island must be accompanied by invoice or outward certificate of value, to prevent detention at Point du Chene.

Goods intended for exportation at St. John to the United States, and additional goods, when the value exceeds \$50.00, to be accompanied by a U. S. Customs Certificate.
